

Maths Challenge

There is a maths challenge for your child to complete every fortnight. Children **do not need to write anything down in their book**. All of these number facts will help them in maths lessons. Remember if the challenge is too hard or too easy then change the numbers. Your child can always come back to a challenge that they need some extra help with. Your child will have a **short test in Friday's maths lesson** to see how well they have completed the challenge. Support will then be given during future lessons. Please ask your child's teacher if you have any questions.

Date of assessment:	Maths Challenge	Example test questions	Comment/signature by adult
21 st April	For this weeks' maths challenge we would like you identify the different coins and notes we use in Britain. You need to be able to say what colour each coin/note is and what each edge is like/ how many edges they have.	Can you point to the 2p coin? What note is this?	
5 th May	For this weeks' maths challenge we would like you to be able to complete equivalent expressions e.g. $2 + 5 = 5 + 2$. Remember that the = means balance.	$3 + 2 =$ $2 + \underline{\quad}$ $6 + \underline{\quad} =$ $1 + 6$	
19 th May	For this weeks' maths challenge we would like you to be to say the days of the week and the months of the year. You need to know the order they go in.	What day comes before Tuesday? What month is after July?	

After children have shared their results, maths challenge books should be brought back into school and kept in their trays.
