

As you know reading is a very important part of our curriculum at school and we always aim to hear the children read as much as possible throughout the school week. Medicine during the school day

The office were inundated with medicines last term which is very hard to manage during the school day. Wherever possible, please give your child's medicine to them before and after school. Medicines such as antihistamine, that need to be taken once or twice a day, can be given at home and do not need to come in to school. Any medicines that need to be given during the school day such as antibiotics, should be brought to the school office.

Foundation Stage open day

We are holding an open day on Saturday 9th November between 10.00am and 1.30pm for children looking to start in Nursery and Reception in September 2025.

Foundation Stage Tours

If there are families looking for Nursery/Reception places for September 2025 (ie born between 01.09.21 and 31.08.22 for Nursery and between 01.09.20 and 31.08.21 for Reception), the school is running tours for prospective parents.

Moving on in 2025

Parents of Year 6 children should have received an email with a 'Moving on in 2025' leaflet. This leaflet provides the dates and times when all Hertfordshire schools are holding their open evenings for you to visit before applying for your child's secondary school place.

Can we please remind parents that these tours and open evenings are for children in Year 6 only.

Due to bank closures, we ask that all payments are made online.

Payments for Uniform, School Trips, Milk, Swimming, School Meals and Breakfast and After school clubs can be paid online via the Schoolgateway system which can be accessed by clicking on the link on the school website at the bottom of the home screen. This will open another page to sign in – when you first open an account you will need to click on the New User tab. Enter your mobile number and email address that the school use and you should receive a text message with a pin number. You should then be able to login to the system using this pin number and your email address.

Please note that the system will only show an actual balance for school dinners for children in Nursery and Years 3-6. All other payments are what you can pay not what you owe.

If you have any problems or issues with making payments online, please speak to the school office.

Benefit related Free School Meals

Do you qualify for free school meals?

If you feel that you might be entitled to benefit related free school meals, please visit https://www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/services/schools-and-education/at-school/free-school-meals/free-school-meals.aspx to apply.

School may be able to help with uniform, trips, school dinners if you qualify.

Please note that there has been a change to the income threshold so you may be eligible now even if you weren't before.

If you have already qualified, you do not need to reapply. If you have any questions please contact 0300 123 4048 or email howcan-">howcan-

Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2

and are in receipt of Universal Free School meals, if you are in receipt of benefits you may be entitled to extra funding and support with uniform, swimming lessons and school trips. Please apply via the link above. If you need any assistance please ask the school office.

Please can we remind parents that **Year 3** are **charged** for their school meals. If you are in receipt of qualifying benefits you should apply for free school meals as soon as possible, as they are not usually backdated and you will need to cover the cost of meals already taken.

Children going to Year 3 from Year 2 MUST apply even if you currently qualify



Helping Parents understand Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance

From 19 August 2024, there is a National Framework for Penalty Notice Fines being issued for unauthorised absences recorded by schools.

National Threshold

A single consistent national threshold for when a Penalty Notice <u>must</u> be considered by <u>ALL</u> schools in England, this is:

- 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.
- These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence.
- For example, a 5-day unauthorised leave of absence would meet the national threshold.
- The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

Who may be fined?

- Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent who allows their child to be absent without authorisation from school
- For example, 3 siblings absent for unauthorised leave during term-time would result in each parent/carer receiving 3 separate fines.

Definition of Parent

- Section 576 of the Education Act 1996 states that, in relation to a child or young person, a 'parent' includes any
 person who is not a parent (from which can be inferred 'biological parent') but who has parental responsibility
 for or care of the child.
- Parent refers to a person who typically has care of a child or young person if the child lives with them either full
 or part time and they look after them, irrespective of what their biological or legal relationship is with the child.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence, the fine amount will be:

- £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.
- If not paid within 21 days, the fine will increase to £160 per parent, per child, payable between the 22nd and 28th day.

Second Offence (within 3 years)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence, a reduced rate is not available. The amount therefore will be:

£160 per parent, per child – payable within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed, a Penalty Notice WILL NOT be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court:

- Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.
- Cases found guilty in a Magistrates Court can show on the parent's future DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) certificate (Disclosure and Barring Service) due to a <u>'failure to safeguard a child's education'</u>
